#### **Building Security**

The Roberts School, continues to have exterior doors locked after an event in late December. This practice will maintain for an indefinite amount of time. After this event, we began looking at ways to secure our building and make it a safer environment for our students. During this research we found most every school in the state of Montana has the exterior doors locked or a clear site line from the front office to the front door in the case of an emergency. With a clear site line not being an option in our facility, we have looked at alternatives that allow us to communicate with the front office from the front door and open the front door from the front office. We will be reviewing bids for these items at the February School Board meeting.

I appreciate any concerns about the inconvenience and about the door being locked potentially making the school building less welcoming. I hope that people understand that the school administration has discussed these items and feels the best way to serve our students is a safe and secure environment.

#### Basketball

It is near the end of the boys and girls basketball seasons. Both teams are currently 2-10 and will finish the season with two home games and four road games. The final home game and senior night is scheduled for Thursday, February 11<sup>th</sup> versus Bridger. District tournaments are scheduled in Huntley Project and will take place from February 17<sup>th</sup>-20<sup>th</sup>.

Boys' Junior High basketball under the leadership of John Payovich will begin Monday, February 15<sup>th</sup> after school. #### Montana Digital Academy Program

Roberts Schools has had students taking Montana Digital Academy Classes (MTDA) over the last few years. In the 2015-2016 school year our MTDA program took steps towards becoming a mainstay program at our school. In the fall semester alone forty MTDA classes were taken by Roberts High School students. Those students classes represented various subjects groups. Examples include: Psychology, Physics, AP Calculus, Personal Finance, Sports Marketing, Entrepreneurship, Earth Science, and Foreign Languages. Out of those forty classes Roberts students had a combine GPA of 2.975 Which is basically a B average. This program offers our school the opportunity to provide classes in subject areas that are interesting and engaging to our students in areas we would otherwise not be able to offer due to lack of staffing.






