Facility Updates

The summer of 2016 has been very busy for the Robert's Maintenance staff. Over the course of the summer we have updated lockers in the elementary school, replaced desk and tables in many classrooms, redone the parking lot, releveled the track, installed new weight lifting equipment, updated the long jump pit and put fall material under most all of the schools playground equipment. These updates will make the school a more safe and welcoming environment for our students. The cost of these updates were limited by using local labor and help from our local contractors. A large thank you needs to be given to our maintenance staff, Sanford Langager, D-Rock Boyz, Roly's Repair, Baldwin's Landscaping, Jason Pitts, Riverside Gravel and Trucking, Church of the Rockies Mission Volunteers, both hardware stores in Red Lodge, Pro Rental in Laurel and countless others for the volunteer hours given and for being available at a moment's notice when we needed help along the way. It is projects like these that remind me how great our community can be at helping each other out and how skilled many of the community members of Roberts are at their craft.

New Staff

Last spring and over the summer we have hired a group of seven new staff members. This group includes a combination of veteran teachers and first year teachers. All of our new to Roberts teachers have been assigned a mentor and will be great fits to our community and school. I would like to take a moment to introduce each one individually to you.

Cass Cole is our new special education teacher and activities director. He comes to us after spending time in Laurel, Forsyth, and Colstrip over his twenty plus years in education. He is a gradu-

ate of Rocky Mountain College and Billings Central in Billings. He is familiar with small town Montana living and has lived in rural areas and worked on ranches throughout is life. His "help as needed" attitude that he already displayed helping out with summer school and as our activities director, will bring another positive example of leadership and hard work to our students.

Bill Harvison and his wife Candy recently moved to the area and he will be working part time as our Ag Teacher and part time as a local pastor. They have three children and have been living in Manhattan, since moving to Montana in 2013. Bill has nine years teaching experience in Agriculture Education and running an FFA program. He is originally from Mississippi and has a degree from Mississippi State University.

Ashley McCoy is a first year English teacher, but will be starting her sixth year as a teacher after time in Kodiak, Alaska and Casper, Wyoming. She is excited to move to Roberts and be closer to family. She is most excited to be near her nephew. Ashley has a degree from Whitworth University in Elementary Education and has completed a Masters' Degree in Curriculum and Instruction from Concordia University. She is a small town girl growing up in Hot Springs, and is excited to start the next chapter of her life as an English teacher and member of the Roberts community.

He will be teaching 7-12 sciences this year and is looking forward to sharing his love of science with the students of Roberts.

I would also like to welcome our new paraprofessionals, *Misty Pitts* and *Peter Wisniewski*. Both are certified teachers and bring multiple skills to our students. Misty has taught in a few places over the years in lower elementary grades, worked as a one on one paraprofessional and will be working in our elementary helping with our first and second grade combination, our title program, and our art program. Peter has a background as a Biology teacher, one on one paraprofessional, a licensed contractor and an Emergency Medical Services trainer. He will be working with our special education department, our title department and helping out with building maintenance.
