First of all, congratulations to Coach Sarah Wade and the incredible Lady Rockets basketball team for their outstanding achievements this season! Securing 4th place at the State C tournament, the Lady Rockets have soared to new heights, showcasing remarkable skill, teamwork, and determination on the court.

In a historic moment for Montana girls' basketball, the Lady Rockets have solidified their place in the record books as the 3rd highest-scoring team in MHSAA history! Among the shining stars of this phenomenal team, we celebrate Taylee Chirrick for her selection to All-State and All-Conference by setting the MHSAA girls' single-season scoring record. The boys' team also took a significant step forward, returning to divisionals for the first time in many years and taking fourth place. Nate Weber and Thommy Howard were selected for All-Conference.

The FFA has also made huge strides this winter as it prepares for the state. This winter, the FFA has had two district titles, one in horse judging and another in mechanics. These and many other qualifying teams are heading to state FFA April 3-6 in Billings!


Big Picture Update

We will have one more community meeting on the school levy on April 11th at 7 pm in the gymnasium. We will discuss tax implications and our plan to run the levy in two stages: \$95,000 this year and likely looking for an additional \$95,000 the following year. As laid out in the school board's letter, 90% of the first year's money will go to teacher and classified staff raises. The other 10% will be used to catch up with inflation and increase insurance, utilities, supplies, and other operating costs. The levy passing, paired with using natural attrition of one certified position, will allow us to raise our teachers by 8% and give our teachers a raise of 10% across the board!

Without this levy passing, we will see a significant impact on student programming. We will also need to reduce an additional one or two teachers, which will significantly reduce our ability to support the students of this great community. Additionally, we would likely see cuts to program offerings and significant increases in participation costs for many program offerings.

Dear Roberts Community Members,

Please be informed we are intending to run a General Mill Levy designed to increase the teacher base salary and thus increase staff retention. As members of the Roberts community, we all share a deep commitment to the success and well-being of our students. Our dedication to providing quality education is evident in the tireless efforts of our educators and staff members. However, we recognize our school district's challenges in recruiting and retaining qualified teachers directly impact the quality of education our students receive.

To address this issue, we are proposing a general mill levy of \$95,000 to support raising the base salary of our teachers by 8%, which equates to an approximately 10% average salary increase across our current teaching staff. This increase is crucial in remaining competitive with neighboring districts and attracting the best talent to our schools. By offering a more competitive salary, we aim to enhance teacher recruitment efforts and ensure that our students continue to receive the high-quality education they deserve. Without this levy, we are still looking at a reduction of staff accompanied by only offering increases to steps and lanes, or about 1.5% across the board. Per anonymous staff vote, the higher raise would lead to an increase in staff retention.

We understand that implementing this mill levy may pose financial concerns for some community members. However, we assure you that we are approaching this issue with careful consideration and fiscal responsibility. In addition to seeking community support through the mill levy, we are committed to using natural attrition to reduce one teacher position, thereby sharing in the cost of increasing teacher salaries.

Furthermore, we anticipate the need for a similar general mill levy in the upcoming year to further enhance the compensation of all staff members, both certified and classified as well as bolster our general budget. Investing in our educators and staff is an investment in our community's future and our students' success.

Your support for this initiative is invaluable. By coming together as a community, we can ensure that Roberts School District continues to provide exceptional education and opportunities for our students. We invite you to consider our general mill levy to benefit our students, teachers, and community. Thank you for your continued dedication to the success of our schools.




