Student Happenings

As we head into February, we are hitting our busiest time of the year. The Lady Rockets are currently seeded in first place in the 6C and are ranked #3 for Class "C" in Montana, while the boys sit in third in the conference as we head closer to district basketball in Red Lodge on February 15-17. The FFA and BPA have been busy and continue to be busy with district and regional competitions as they prepare for state. Also, our Friday program has two ski days left on February 2nd and 23rd, then goes to the Steep World Climbing Center on March 22nd.

Big Picture Update

Last fall, we had a community meeting to help us connect with the greater community, update on school finance, and collect information to accomplish two big goals. The first is to update our Strategic Plan (big picture goals and how to meet them) and then create a Graduate Profile (a list of values and skills all graduates should have). The board and the superintendent have drafted a Strategic Plan, and we would like your feedback on this and the likelihood of a mill levy for the school on Thursday, February 22nd, at 7 pm at the Roberts Fire Hall.

Our next steps will be to take feedback from this meeting and likely approve a proposal to run a general mill levy for the district at our board meeting on Friday, February 23rd, at 5 pm. The school and, specifically, the students urge your support and questions. Our school offers a variety of programs and curricular opportunities that are likely to be cut or reduced if we cannot pass a mill levy as we look to balance the budget in tough financial times for everyone. We at the school understand it is a tough ask, as many of you are feeling financial difficulties with inflation and the increases in local housing costs. Still similarly, we are also experiencing the same limitations at the school and need your support to continue to offer high-quality programming here.

As we release talking points, they will be shared on social media (Roberts Rockets Facebook Page & school Remind app) and shared at locations around town. Please call the school and ask questions as you encounter them. As with any information, there are natural questions, and we want to support you in ensuring that we will be transparent and honest in our answers.


