# Roberts Rockets October-November 2016

#### Volleyball

The Roberts varsity volley team has started off the 2016-2017 with a 3 win and 6 loss record. The team has one Senior, Kylee Everett, one Junior, Avery Walker, one sophomore, Maddisyn Allen, two Freshman, Alexis Hess and Josie Hollo and three eight graders, McKenzie Pitts, Rylan Niemi and Emma DeVries. The team is under the leadership of second year coaches Melissa Bertolino and Theresa Kosel. The District tournament is October 27<sup>th</sup>-29<sup>th</sup> is Absarokee.

The Junior High and Elementary seasons are also under way. The older group is off to a 5-1 start while the younger group is holding strong at 2 wins and 3 losses. Both teams are being coached by Jackie Ronning and Lindy Allen. We currently have one  $8^{th}$  grader, six  $7^{th}$  graders, two  $6^{th}$ graders, two  $5^{th}$  graders and three  $4^{th}$  graders making up our two teams.

#### **Cross Country**

The high school team has had a very strong fall. The team is made up of seven boys: Senior, Max Romero; Junior, Gus Dines; Junior, Andy VanOrnum; Junior, Allexander Kosel; Sophomore, Ryan DeVries; Sophomore, Boone Schmaltz, and Freshman, Garret Pitts. The Rockets are once again very competitive on a local and state wide basis. In a local meet in Red Lodge they took  $2^{nd}$  place as a team while running against class B and Class A schools. On a statewide basis they are sitting  $2^{nd}$  in the state and look to equal or even improve on last year's  $3^{rd}$  place finish.

The Roberts Cross Country success is not limited to high school as the team includes three Junior High Boys and four Junior High girls. They also have been running hard and are hoping to expand on the success of our program.

#### **MAP Testing**

Last year Roberts School began using the Measured Assessment of Progress testing series in Math, English and Science. This data is very precise and helps us measure our student growth and achievement. It also gives ours teachers' data to look and decipher what areas we are doing well in and what areas we need to focus on. We should be sending home your son or daughters growth from last year with the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter midterms. We will once again be doing this test three times this year. The timelines are beginning of the school year, after the winter break and end of the school year.

Roberts Students Rank at the 50th percentile in Math and English Reading. They rank in the 55<sup>th</sup> percentile in English Language and the 61<sup>st</sup> percentile in Science. What this means if 100 schools were lined up we would be at or in front of the middle of the line in all four subjects. With our small school this is definitely an area we feel we can continue to improve on and we plan to put the data to good use to try to improve on this. A couple things that are important to remember about these test is they are optional. Many schools do not test their whole school or do not participate in the test at all.

#### **Student Council**

Student Council elections were held at the start of school and I would like to congratulate the officers: Student Body President, Kylee Everett; Student Body Vice-President, Jess Mysse; and Student Body Secretary & Treasurer, Avery Walker. The Student Council first major project is homecoming. The Homecoming events are scheduled for the week of October 3<sup>rd</sup>- 8<sup>th</sup>.

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
# Bookaneers Book Fair

### Hello from the English Department!

We are off and running now! Students have been working hard on their units and many have already completed their first units of instruction. English 9 and English 10/11 have been focusing on closely reading short stories and poems while identifying the central idea of the text. English 12 has taken the route of examining an autobiography and discussing the technique the author used to create a powerful message. They will use similar techniques while composing a personal narrative essay that may be used in potential college essays. 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students are working on similar units and standards. They have been practicing identifying evidence in the text to support their ideas and explain what the text means. There primary text has been a fictional story, but we are connecting the information to real-world events with informational articles. Students have been working hard and putting forth a lot of effort. Keep it up!

As a side note, almost all of the students should have an independent reading book (informational or literature) and it would be wonderful if they are reading their books outside of school. Even 5 minutes a night makes a difference!

## 1st and 2nd Grade Happenings

Time sure does fly when we're having fun! Students just completed their unit about Montana. We learned about the rivers, animals and the Bitterroot is the State flower. Did you know some of Montana's Native Americans use the Bitterroot to eat? We also met Brutus the Bear *via* a few videos. He lives on the Bozeman Pass if your family wants to meet him in real life!

We did our first science experiment. Students were given a coffee filter and had to take their black markers and draw a big spot right in the middle of the coffee filter. Then they were asked to make a prediction about what would happen when we sprayed water on the black spot? Some kids said the filter would curl up. Others said the black spot would start to grow and get bigger. Then we sprayed water on the filters and all the kids started to "OOOH and AHHH" as many different colors started to spread across the filter! Who knew that black is made from all the other colors?

Also, in science we are just finishing up a unit on life cycles. We have learned about many different critters: frogs, salmon, ants, and chickens. We will soon begin a unit on landforms.

As we learn about the seven continents, we are doing some fun art projects too. For Antarctica we painted a winter scene and drew penguins.

The kids want to say "Thank You" to The Ladies of Kaleva for coming in again this year and listening to them read. All the extra practice is helping them become great readers.

Our class also gets to do art with Mrs. Pitts once a week. This week the kids learned about ancient cave paintings and then made them too.
