Volleyball

The Roberts varsity volleyball team is off to the district volleyball tournament in Absarokee. They enter as the 7th seed and it will take place October 29th through 31st. The team is a young, talented team that keeps improving. I am proud of the consistent effort and improvement this group of ladies has demonstrated this season.

Cross Country

The Rocket Cross Country team placed 3rd at the State Class "C" meet. Our top individual was Gus Dines taking 5th overall. All six of the Robert's runners placed in the top 70 out of the 143 state finalists. This was a great accomplishment for our students, especially considering a roster that had just one junior, and the rest of the team consisted of freshman and sophomores.

Results: Gus Dines, sophomore, 5th place; Andy VanOrnum, sophomore, 23rd place; Boone Schmaltz, freshman, 24th place, Ryan Devries, freshman, 31st place; Max Romero, junior, 61st place; Allexander Kosel, sophomore, 69th place.

MAPS Testing

Roberts School has completed its first round of MAP's testing. Data will be sent home with parents in the report cards. The most important part of the data for a parent to look at is the percentile score. This looks at baseline data and theoretically tells you wear your son or daughter places in the particular subject out of 100 kids.

An example would be a 90th percentile in third grade math, interprets to your student would be approximately 10^{th} best out of a random group of 100 kids. Another example would be 65^{th} percentile means your student would 35^{th} best out of a random group of 100 kids.




